Gonzales Defeats Hoad In Thrilling Tennis Encounter

BRISBANE, Australia (AP) — Pancho Gonzales, professional tennis champion from Los Angeles, defeated Australia's Lew Hoad Thursday in a thrilling, five-set battle that opened their 100-match series.

An overflow crowd of 9,000 fans at Milton Courts saw the tall Californian edge Hoad 5-7, 8-6, 6-2, 4-6, 9-7.

Police reinforcements were called out to control crowds seeking admission. More than 3,000 fans in this tennis-mad city were turned away and more than 500 were permitted to sit on the grounds rimming the court.

It took Gonzales two hours and 33 minutes to conquer the former Wimbledon champion and Davis Cup star. Hoad was more impressive than when he first turned pro last summer and absorbed beatings from most members of promoter Jack Krmer's tennis troupe.

Rosi-Busso Match Tonight

NEW YORK (AP) — Barring flood, flu or typhoon, the lightweight match between Paolo Rosi and Johnny Busso finally will be fought tonight. It has been postponed four times.

The two ranking 135-pounders will headline the first card of the new year at Madison Square Garden in a 10-round match. The fight will be carried on NBC radio and television networks.

Rosi and Busso spent most of 1957 waiting for the day when both would be sound. It never came. Originally scheduled for March, they finally had to settle for a new year.

Rosi, transplanted Italian who has settled in New York's Bronx with his American wife, is ranked fifth among contenders for Joe Brown's title by the National Boxing Association and Ring Maga-

Sid Abel Returns To Red Wings As Hockey Coach

DETROIT (AP) — Sid Abel, who centered Detroit's greatest National Hockey League forward line, returned to the Red Wings Thursday as coach following Jimmy Skinner's unexpected resignation.

Skinner said Thursday he quit on the advice of his physician, Dr. Milton L. Krosley, who had been treating him for persistent migraine headaches. Skinner took over the Red Wings 3½ seasons ago and led them to two first and one second place finish.

Abel was a star for the Red Wings from 1938 through 1952 and was among the NHL's top 10 scorers five seasons. He centered the famed Production Line that included Gordie Howe and Ted Lindsay on the wings. Howe still is a Detroit standout. Lindsay now is with the Chicago Black Hawks.
