TRYON W.I.

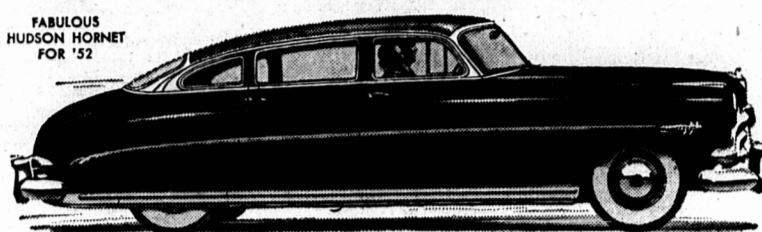

Roll call was answered by seven members naming a flower. A quilt top made by the president, was

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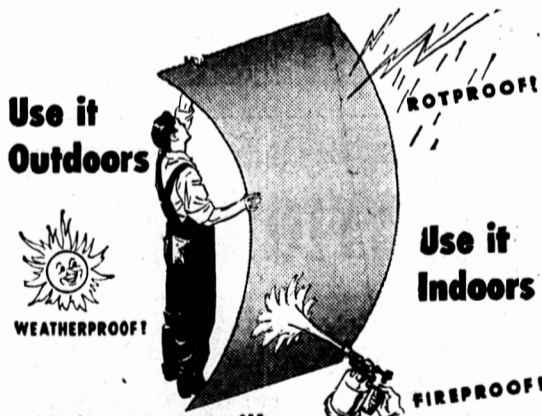
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
