Cyrus Eaton Hits Out Anew At State Department Views

NORTHFIELD, Ohio (CP)—Cyrus S. Eaton hit out anew Saturday at the U.S. state department for what he termed its wishful thinking that Soviet Russia and China are so deeply at odds that they will not act together in an attempt to crush capitalism. The catalyst would be Viet Van where the United States is pouring in troops. The U.S.S.R. and China would submerge any differences that exist in a common defence of socialism. The 81-year-old Cleveland industrialist reiterated in an interview what he said publicly last Monday in Detroit: The United States is on a collision course with communism in Southeast Asia.

He expressed his views on international affairs while walking around his Acadia Farms here during the annual sale of the farm's prize shorthorns. The sale brought the highest prices in recent years. **BACKS OWN FORECAST** Eaton, native of Pugwash, N.S., and sponsor of the Pugwash conferences on world problems, stuck by his Detroit prediction that "unless some miracle occurs in the next month" the world faces catastrophe. He was aware that some persons in Canada and the United States thought the was an alarmist but "I wasn't seeking to enter a popularity contest." Eaton, just returned from a three-week visit to Russia and other Iron Curtain countries in Europe, was reminded that almost a week of his one-to-four-week time limit for disaster to happen had expired. He said: "Any weather forecaster is allowed a margin of error of one or two days. It will happen—perhaps not right now but soon."

He was more interested Saturday in his cattle sale than in international affairs. Forty-eight females and 14 bulls, from the Acadia Farms herd here and from other U.S. breeders, sold for a total of \$59,980. Short-horns from Eaton's Deep Cove farm in Nova Scotia are part of the Acadia foundation stock.

Prizes Given To 16 Artists

MONTREAL (CP)—Cheques totalling \$2,500 were presented Friday night to 16 "Sunday painters" among Canadian commercial artists, with the top award of \$800 going to George Paginton, staff artist with the Toronto Star. Prizes were presented at a dinner by T. R. Moore, president of Price Brothers Ltd., A. M. Welch, vice-president of the company, was chairman and Ray Cattell, president of the Toronto Art Directors Club, was guest speaker. Mr. Paginton's oils "Floating Logs" was judged last month by a panel of leading Canadian art authorities as the best of an even 100 entries. A cheque for \$500 went to Alan Gold, a Montreal commercial artist who won second prize with an oil titled simply "Margaret." Burnie Sidon, a Toronto creative designer, received the third prize of \$350 for his water color impression of the midway at the Toronto exhibition. Fourth prize went to George Rae, art director of the Family Herald in Montreal. Mr. Paginton's prize-winning submission was painted on the Fraser River in British Columbia and depicted a tug hauling a log boom. In addition to the first four, 12 other prizewinners were presented with \$50 cheques.

Top price of the day was \$4,800, paid by an Illinois buyer for a half-interest in Arrowsmith Rodney II. Highest prices paid for females were by Alendale Farms of Flesherton, Ont.—\$3,000 for Golden Chain IV and \$2,600 for Golden Chain V from the Boll Weevil Plantation in Weynesboro, Ga.

Of Nova Scotia, Eaton said there was great potentiality for agriculture—"there is no better grass in the world than in Nova Scotia"—and the province had plenty of moisture with no crop failures. The marsh areas of the province could be opened, but "we need to improve the vision of Nova Scotia political leaders so they will see the great agricultural potential in that province." He did not amplify his remark. He thought his native province was due for "a great renewal." He would like to see the young men of the province "make a living wage" so they wouldn't have to leave home in search of opportunity.

Annual School Meetings

Ratepayers and all persons entitled to vote at school meetings are hereby notified that the Annual School Meeting of each district in the province will be held, as required by Law on **TUESDAY, JUNE 1, 1965 AT 8:00 P.M. Daylight Saving Time**

Who May Vote at These Meetings
1. Every person who, or whose husband or wife, is a ratepayer in the district, and who, and whose husband or wife, has paid in full all district school rates and taxes, including dog tax if assessed, imposed upon him, may vote at any school meeting on any question.
2. Every woman residing in the district and being the mother, step-mother or adoptive mother of a child of school age residing with her and in actual attendance at the school of the district, shall be a qualified voter at all school meetings and shall be eligible for election as a trustee unless she shall be in arrears of school taxes or dog tax assessed against her.

--- Section 27 of the School Act.
The Order of Business is detailed in Section 29 of the School Act.
Letters from the Department of Education and the Superintendent of Schools have been sent to School Board Secretaries and should be read at these meetings.
Districts that are not now included in a regular high school unit must apply to the Department of Education if they wish to join a unit. Requests will be passed to the Boundaries Commission who will determine the unit that a district may join. A special meeting of the ratepayers may then be called by the Department of Education for the purpose of voting on the question of joining the unit designated by the Boundaries Commission.
