**U.S. To Cut Commission Okays New Draft Money For Of Divine Revelation Thesis UN Force**

VATICAN CITY (AP)—A special commission of the Roman Catholic ecclesiastical council has approved a new draft of the thesis on divine revelation, the commission of office announced here today.

It was one of the thorniest issues of the council's last session last fall.

The text of the new draft was not disclosed but there was a hint it may carry over to a so-called progressive group which in the original version might harm the thesis toward Christian unity. The new title "sources" and is called merely On Divine Revelation.

The draft will be submitted to the full council after it reconvenes in September. The council met recessed Dec. 8.

Before the recess, a sharp controversy broke out on the thesis and Jean-Marie Perrier, the special commission to draft a new one.

The original version, supported by conservatives, was entitled Sources of Revelation. It elaborated on Catholic teach-

ing that the revealed word of God is found both in scripture and tradition.

Protestants accept only scripture.

The progressives opposed the thesis, claiming it would not advance efforts to achieve closer ties among Christian churches.
