

Mayo Clinic's Doctors Try Automation Plan On Patients

ROCHESTER, Minn. (AP)—Some feel the idea will become widespread in a few years, with each patient given an electronic computer in a routine analysis of his blood. Patients in seven of the clinic's 20 sections are given a long, brown envelope as they wait to see their doctors. In it is the Minnesota personality inventory, a test developed at the University of Minnesota in 1941 and now in wide use. Patients are told: "This is an inventory of your personality. By filling it out, you will summarize the kind of person you are. This will help us solve your problem."

The questions—calling for true or false answers—are marked with a special pencil which triggers a computer when the test is fed through. Stored on the computer's magnetic tapes are many possible responses to the questions, and a system of analyzing the patient's particular pattern of responses. Some of the questions: "I enjoy reading newspaper articles on crime." "I wake up most days feeling fresh and well rested." "I work under tension." "I loved my father." "I generally feel life is worth living."

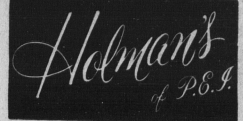

Film Proposal Is Rejected by Pentagon
WASHINGTON (AP)—Pentagon officials, shuddering at the thought, have waved off a tentative suggestion that the defense department co-operate

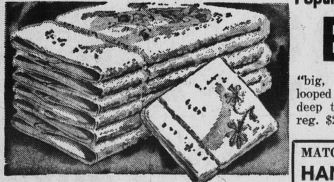
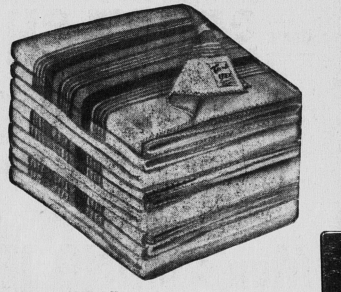
