New Vehicle May Speed Development In Northland

CALGARY (CP)—Major breakthroughs on two of the thorniest technical problems confronting the oil and gas industry have been announced by two oil companies.

One is a 16 1/2-ton land transport vehicle capable of moving drilling equipment into remote areas over treacherous muskeg 12 months of the year. If further tests are successful it is conceivable exploration and development in the Canadian north could be speeded up 400 per cent.

Another is a chemical method of curbing the deadly power of hydrogen sulphide gas produced by "sour" natural gas wells. The poisonous gas, known generally as rotten egg gas, was responsible for four deaths in 1957.

Ground transportation in parts of the northland is limited to three or four months when the muskeg—soil laced with water and ice particles—is frozen.

The Shell Oil Company has completed preliminary tests on the Nodwell, a track vehicle which overcomes soggy terrain by exerting a ground-bearing pressure of about two pounds a square inch, approximately one-fifth the pressure exerted by previously used machines.

The company used it last July to transport equipment and supplies into a drilling site on the Steen River 500 miles north of Edmonton.

John Stuart, Shell's area auto superintendent, said the Nodwell manoeuvred through sludge and mire that would have swallowed ordinary vehicles. Up to 10 tons can be carried each trip on a flat-bed trailer at a speed of six miles an hour.

SNOW TESTS IN WINTER
The vehicle, built to Shell's specifications by Bruce Nodwell Limited of Calgary, will be tested this winter on snow.

Mr. Stuart said experiments have shown the maximum load muskeg can handle is two pounds a square inch. The Nodwell is able to keep within these bounds through use of broad nylon cord tracks.

Details are being turned over to the petroleum industry in Canada and the United States. The company says the machine means dollar savings and more operations for companies and men in dangerous areas. Cost of the engine and protective machine used sometimes amounts to \$100 for each well.

Hydrogen sulphide long has been an obnoxious problem in Alberta's "sour" gas fields. It has been an unavoidable part of the petrochemical industry—reduction of natural gas by-products.

Farmers in the Red Deer district decided recently to legislate controlling emissions of hydrogen gas into the atmosphere. One of their complaints was the odor upon the milk habits of their cows.

Shell owns three Nodwells, 30 feet long and 11 feet wide. They are powered with two engines each rated at 105 horsepower, at the top of a modern automobile. A gear of 22:1 transmits power to sets of tracks.

Mr. Stuart foresees more drilling, road and railway construction through use of such machines.

NEUTRALIZER FOUND
J. U. Messenger of Calgary, petrochemical specialist in drilling muds for Mobil Oil Company, has found a method of fighting hydrogen sulphide with ammonium hydroxide, a neutralizing base.

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
