Correspondence on the Clayton-Bulwer Treaty has been submitted to the United States Senate, in which Mr. Frelinghuysen, in a letter to Lord Granville, maintains the claims of the United States to exclusive jurisdiction, and charges Great Britain with breaking the stipulations of the agreement, in extending her possession of British Honduras.

The largest four-masted schooner ever built in this country is now on the ways at the shipyard of E. Porter Keen at North Weymouth, nearly ready for launching. Her dimensions are: Length of keel, 193 feet 6 inches; deck, 288 feet; width, 40 feet 10 in., sail, 5 feet 4 inches. She has two decks clean fore and aft, with a poopdeck taking in the mizzenmast. The windlass will have a steam attachment. She is constructed from the best Connecticut white oak, floors double and is copperfastened. Her burden will be about 1,400 tons, with a capacity of carrying 5,000 bales of cotton. She will be indexed under French Lloyd's special survey, fifteen years' rate, and is intended for the cotton trade between Galveston and Providence. Capt. G. B. Hussey, a part owner, will take command. She will be named "Heraldine," in compliment to the daughter of Herald Peck, Esq., one of the principal owners. - Boston Globe.

The whiskey distillers of the United States, who failed to induce the Canadian Government to amend the law in their interest, are renewing their efforts to obtain relief from Congress. An extension of two years of the time within which the tax upon whiskey in bond must be paid is asked. There were remaining in bond June 30, 83, 962,646 gallons of whiskey; and, according to Mr. Folger's report, 29,600,043 gallons should come out of the warehouses July 6, 1884, on which the tax due government (and on which the owners are paying no interest) would amount to \$26,640,038.70. To be credited to surplus revenue. If the scheme of a number of prominent politicians for the repeal of all internal revenue taxes were carried, the effect would be to place about ninety millions dollars in the pockets of the distillers. Already an extension of two years has been granted by Congress, and it is questionable if further concessions will be made to an interest which has so little to commend its demands.
