## THE LEGISLATURE.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DEBATES.

MR. LAIRD was particularly gratified at the happy state of mind of the honorable Leader of the Opposition.

That honorable gentleman has a considerable knowledge of the country and the people and it is pleasing to find him congratulating himself on the prosperous condition of the country.

It is probable the people of this Province are able to pay their bills, and good crops for a few years would enable them to overcome their difficulties.

This country is suffering greater distress than it should for the want of knowledge that might be obtained.

In older countries there is a system of ascertaining percentage of the crop of any one year as compared with an average crop, and if this were known in the autumn farmers would be in a better position to judge how much stock to keep through the winter, or supplement their supply of fodder earlier in the season.

Something of this kind might be done in the future, and would be an advantage to both farmers and business men.

The shortage in the hay crop last year was almost universal, and the farmers have suffered in consequence.

The Leader of the Opposition said the debt contracted by the late Government was only a running debt, but the trouble was it had run up to a pretty high figure.

At this time in the Island's history with the country all settled, there should be no debts contracted, we should be prepared to shoulder the burdens and pay as we go.
