BULLETINS FROM BIRDLAND

MATING DATES

More than 550 years ago the English poet, Chaucer, wrote about birds chasing their mates on St. Valentine's Day, and 250 years later another poet, Herrick, used the very same expression. The belief that birds mate on February 14th is very old indeed, and it was only comparatively recently that men grew wiser. Now we know there is no definite date for this exciting event in Birdland, and furthermore that February is too early, even in England, for the majority of species.

Of course there are kinds that remain mated for life, as Canada Geese. These, therefore, we might see in couples at any season. In Canada we miss the mating of many shore birds and Ducks, as this is now taking place in their southern holiday resort, and may have happened as early as January. It is said to be amusing to see a pair of Mallards in flight—the female leading, the male following. As they have such different colouring it is easy to distinguish between the two.

Ordinarily, however, birds do their courting right on the spot where they later make homes and rear families. Some are permanent residents here. Two Great Horned Owls may now be making love to one another, as it is not unusual for them to nest in the snow. Most Owls use hollow trees, and the eggs are safe from the elements, but Great Horned Owls take over discarded nests of Hawks or Crows, built in branches of large trees. Bob-whites, also permanent residents, start their housekeeping extremely early, and their eggs may be found almost any month of the year.

Prairie Horned Larks arrive about the beginning of March, and start courting soon afterwards. Killdeer Plovers' eggs are frequently found before mid-April, the birds having got here a few weeks previously. Most species come to us in May, and some even wait until June. The male generally appears first, takes up a piece of territory, and advertises that he is ready for a wife by making himself conspicuous. This is done for all to hear, by singing, or for all to see, by puffing out his breast, spreading his tail, gaping, bowing, or going through some other antics. Once having attracted a female, he may kiss her, offer her food, bring her nesting material, or simply go through further acrobatic stunts, according to his species. Is our birdlife changing?

U. S. Steel

CLEVELAND, (AP) — The end of price controls won't result in a general increase in steel prices, Steel magazine says. Steel supply is catching up with demand, the magazine says, and "the steel industry won't want to risk incurring adverse public reaction a general price increase might bring."

In its weekly summary of the metalworking industry, the magazine also says a boost might be considered unfair to President Eisenhower. The President has said he plans to lift all price controls. Steel, however, predicts there will be some "adjustments" in steel prices, and most of them upward. These will be needed, to correct "imbalances that have arisen in a rigid structure of prices under government controls."

After that prices will move up and down in response to demand and "production costs will tend to maintain balance among prices."

Expect Drop On N. Y. Market To Run Course Soon

NEW YORK, (AP) — The stock market staggered under a one-two selling punch last week and suffered its greatest decline in more than 15 months. The set-back was neither unexpected nor alarming. Those who have been predicting the drop felt that it would run its course within a month at the latest. Others forecast a recovery followed by a spirited rally that will once again set the market on its upward path. The Associated average of 60 stocks lost \$2.31 last week, the greatest decline for the average since the week ended Oct. 27, 1951. The railroad component was the hardest hit. Why the big fall? Here are some reasons advanced: President Eisenhower is proposing many things that spell a lower government spending, budget balancing, no immediate tax cuts, reduced government spending for construction, a calm attitude toward sliding commodity prices, plus talk about possible consumer credit curbs.

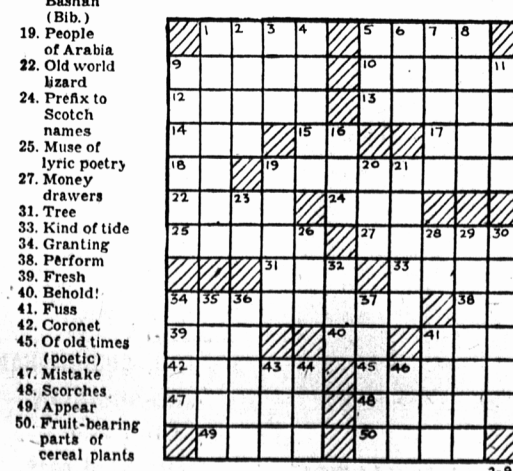
