Island Red Cross Given Merit Medal

The P.E.I. Division of the Canadian Red Cross Society has received notification from its National Headquarters in Toronto, that the Canadian Society has recently been presented with the Gold Medal of Merit by the Austrian Red Cross Society. This medal and scroll were presented by Dr. Kurt Waldheim, Austrian ambassador to Canada, to Mr. George Aitken of Winnipeg, who is the Chairman of the Central Council, Canadian Red Cross Society, at a meeting of the National Executive Committee held recently in Toronto.

In making the presentation, Dr. Waldheim voiced the gratitude of the Austrian government and the Austrian people to Canada, and stated that his nation will never forget Canada's help during the hectic months when more than 200,000 Hungarians flowed into Austria.

He praised the work of the Canadian Red Cross medico-social teams, and thanked the Canadian Red Cross for the relief supplies sent to the Austrian Red Cross. Dr. Waldheim told his audience again that Canadian aid was among the foremost sent to Austria by nations throughout the world.

Communist Hungary Levels Blast At U. S. Diplomats

BUDAPEST (AP)—Communist Hungary Saturday accused U.S. diplomats of offences ranging from espionage to careless driving and threatened action, depending on their "future attitude."

Government press chief Laszlo Gyarus charged at a press conference that the U.S. Budapest legation "is employing intelligence agents under diplomatic cover" who are "doing undermining and destructive work against the homeland."

Gyarus said the purpose of these "strange diplomats" was to obtain "detailed data for their destructive work on the Hungarian people's army . . . on all fields of our political, economic and scientific life . . . and on the Soviet armed forces stationed in Hungary."

Asked if action would be taken to oust U.S. diplomats, he declared: "It will depend on their future attitude."

Last year, the Communists expelled then U.S. air attache Col. Welwyn Frederick Dallam, and assistant army attache Capt. Thomas R. Gleason, both accused of espionage.
