SYDNEY (CP)—Cape Breton All-Stars, bolstered by the addition of five players from mainland Nova Scotia, whipped Charlottetown Abbies 8-3 here Thursday night to capture the Maritime Junior "A" Hockey Championship.

Cape Breton won the opening game of the best-of-three series at Charlottetown 6-5 in overtime Monday.

Halifax juvenile player, who scored four goals. Ross Keeping of Glace Bay shot a pair, Sonny Salzyn of Glace Bay and Jack Coffin of Sydney got singles.

Cape Breton led 1-0 at the end of the first and 4-1 after two periods.

Montreal Sets New Record By Defeating Toronto 7-4

MONTREAL (CP)—Montreal Canadiens ran away from Toronto Maple Leafs in the last period Thursday night to win a wide open but loosely played game 7-4 and set up a season record for scoring in the National Hockey League.

Canadians ran their season count to a record 243 goals, seven more than the old mark of 236 set by Detroit Red Wings in the 1950-51 season.

Connie Broden, star centre of the Whitey team that recently won Canada's world tournament in Oslo, scored two of Montreal's goals — the only two-goal man for their side — and got an assist.

Canadians held a 3-2 lead going into the last period. Helped when the Leafs went shorthanded — once two men down — the NHL champions cut loose with a scoring spurge that quickly left the Leafs behind.

In addition to Broden's pair, other Montreal scorers were Marcel Bonin, Andre Pronovost, Dickie Moore, Doug Harvey and Jean Beliveau.

The Leaf scorers were Barry Cullen, Tim Horton, Tod Sloan and George Armstrong.

NEW GLASGOW (CP)—New Glasgow Rangers repulsed a determined third period attack by Hull Legion Thursday to score a 5-4 win and take a 2-1 lead in their best-of-five Allan Cup series. The fourth game will be played here tonight.

Robinson Ready To Meet Basilio In Favorite City

CHICAGO (AP)—Sugar Ray Robinson uses the Chicago Stadium ring as a guillotine for pretenders to what he considers his rightful middleweight throne.

He will try to regain the 160-pound crown from Carmen Basilio next Tuesday night in the same stadium ring where he won, successfully defended or recaptured it four times.

Gene Fullmer blithely defended the middleweight championship against Robinson here May 1, 1957. Four months earlier Fullmer led Robinson a merry chase for 15 rounds in New York and dethroned Sugar Ray. When they met in Chicago Stadium Robinson stalked Fullmer for four rounds, then knocked him out in the fifth.

Basilio also dethroned Robinson in New York. The 15-round battle last Sept. 23 was a blood-and-thunder affair in which Sugar Ray never had to look far to find his pounding for or scrape him off the back of his neck. Like Fullmer, Basilio also is favored the second time around.

Chicago Stadium in 1955 was the scene of both the most hu-

milating the glory-filled action in Robinson's fabulous ring career. Trying a comeback after his retirement in 1952, Sugar Ray was belted like a preliminary boy by Ralph (Tiger) Jones.

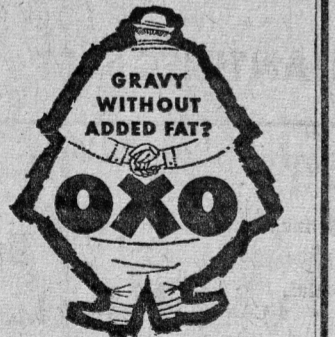
