Conferece On Air Safety

BERLIN, (AP)—The Allied high commissioners will meet in Berlin Saturday, March 28, to discuss a possible four-power pact on air safety over Germany, informed quarters reported Friday night. The move arises from a Soviet suggestion by General Vassily Chulikov that an Anglo-Russian meeting be held to discuss methods of avoiding such incidents as the Russian jet fighter attacks on three British planes in the last week. One bomber was shot down with the loss of seven lives.

Chulikov contended that the British planes had been in the wrong, but his proposal to talk it over was viewed by the London foreign office as both reasonable and conciliatory.
