Standstill In Cancer Treatment Radiology At

QUEBEC (CP)—Radiation treatment of cancer seems to have reached a "plateau of achievement," the American Radium Society heard Friday.

Improvements must depend on advances in the biology and biochemical fields to catch up with technical progress, said Dr. Simon T. Cantrell of Seattle, Wash. He forecast no rapid advance.

"Radioactive substances can be had in a wealth of energies and compounds. Yet with all these additions to our tool we seem to have reached a plateau of achievement."

The technicians, he said, have far outdistanced medical understanding of biological action and a more fundamental knowledge of cancer's biochemistry must be gained before radio isotopes can pour out their full potential against the disease.

"We have," he told 400 delegates to the conference, "only a pinhole view of what may some day prove to be a fascinating panorama."

He suggested three ways in which biology could pave the way for better radiation treatment.

It could alter the resistance of a cancerous growth to radiation, and also devise a way for normal tissue to be made more resistant to radiation—allowing deep, intensive treatment to be applied to cancerous areas.

Finally, it might provide a way to speed repair in normal tissue damaged by the radiation used to cure cancerous growths.

"We may expect from biology, biophysics and chemistry the century development of knowledge which may give greater effectiveness to radiation therapy," Dr. Cantrell said, "but it does not appear that rapid advance can be anticipated."

Dr. Cantrell's lecture was the feature scientific address at the conference, the first in Canada. Attending are radiologists and specialists in treatments of malignant diseases with radioactive substances. The congress ends today.

John Bracken Blasts Gov't

OTTAWA (CP)—John Bracken, former Progressive Conservative leader, has entered the political arena with his first big political speech since he retired in 1948.

Mr. Bracken, who will be 74 in three weeks, said Thursday night the Liberal government "is responsible for more sub-marginal farms in Canada than any other government since Confederation."

"The more costs go up for the farmer and prices of his commodities don't follow, the more farms we'll have which will not support the farmer and his family."

He spoke at nearby Osgoode and Manotick in support of R. A. Bell, party candidate in Carleton. Mr. Bell was the party's national director during the period Mr. Bracken was party leader 1942-48.

Says Statement Regarding Hospital Payments False

KELOWNA, B.C. (CP)—A paragraph of news background used in an Ottawa dispatch by The Canadian Press led Premier Bennett of British Columbia to say Wednesday night that the Liberals had used CP to spread false propaganda at election time.

The dispatch to which he referred was the May 23 announcement from Health Minister Martin's Ottawa office that the federal government proposes to continue \$13,000,000 - a year hospital construction grants for five years after the current five-year program runs out next year.

Intending to make this an announcement more understandable to readers, CP—the national news-gathering co-operative—said: "The grants have been in effect since 1948. The central treasury makes the money available for new hospital construction on a 50-50 matching basis with the provinces, and with some contributions from the municipalities."

BENNETT CITED DISPATCH
Mr. Bennett, quoting from this dispatch as published in the Victoria Times, interpreted this as meaning that Mr. Martin had promised the Liberals would share entire hospital construction costs on a 50-50 basis with the provinces. "This is a lie," Mr. Bennett said, "because Ottawa pays only \$1,000 a bed, while it costs between \$12,000 and \$13,000 a bed to construct a hospital."

Mr. Martin's March 23 statement did not say the federal government would pay half the entire cost of hospital building and CP's explanatory matter on the announcement was not intended to give that impression.

The formula for federal grants toward hospital construction is the same in all provinces. It provides for a federal contribution of up to \$1,000 a bed for general hospital building; \$1,500 a bed for hospitals for treatment of chronic patients; \$500 a bed for nurses' residences; and \$1,000 for every 300 square feet of space for laboratories, community health centres and the like. The total federal grant may not exceed one-third of the total cost of a construction project.

Each grant must be matched by a grant of the same amount to the province concerned. Any municipal contribution is an arrangement between the province and municipality. A provincial government may make additional grants to any project.

Calls Officials Sawdust Caesars

TORONTO (CP)—George Hees, Progressive Conservative, says officials of the Unemployment Insurance Commission are "sawdust Caesars" who treat job applicants with insolence and arrogance.

"This type of attitude stems right from the top and says of the cabinet, which sets government policy," Mr. Hees said Friday night in an election speech in Toronto Broadway, where he is seeking re-election.

The commission should be overhauled completely so that it could serve as it was intended to—instead of being a source of frustration and annoyance to most Canadians.

The statements were contained in the text of a speech issued to the press before delivery.

Mr. Hees, former president of the national Progressive Conservative Association, said people in all parts of the country have told him of arrogant treatment received when applying for a job through the commission.

"After waiting long hours with no apparent reason for the delay, they are often treated with insolence by the sawdust Caesars employed by the Liberal government."
