New York Stocks

NEW YORK. (AP)—The stock market broke to a new low for the year last week in a sharp selling wave. The selling at one time built up to an intensity not seen since last spring. All sections of the market were engulfed in the lower movement.

Principal sufferers were the railroads, motors, steels and oils, although few major divisions of the market escaped the selling. A fall to a new low by the railroad average soon was followed by a drop in the industrial average to a new low. That convinced traders the market still was going through its general readjustment to an expected curtailment of general business.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks ended the week at \$101.30, a new low for the year and the lowest point for the average since early in May of last year. Canadian Southern Oils, off 1/2 at 6 1/2, was one of the most active issues of the American stock exchange.

Giant Yellowknife and Lake Shore both were down 1/2 at the close of Friday's trading on the American exchange.

Canadian issues also were lower on the New York exchange. McIntyre lost a point. Distillers Seagram fell 1/2 and Canadian Pacific was off 1/2 as the week ended.

U.S. Steel Report. CLEVELAND. (AP)—Steel output dropped last week to its lowest level in the last 13 months. "Steel," the metalworking weekly reported Sunday.

National rate of steel production for ingots and casting was 88.5 per cent of rates capacity, a drop of seven points from the preceding week, the weekly said.

"Steel" said causes for last week's production decline were a strike at Buffalo, lessened steel demand in the West and other areas, and the Labor Day holiday. Plunging scrap prices, "Steel" said, are "spearheading the return of competition to the steel market."

It reported scrap prices declining for the fourth consecutive week, lowering its price composite on steel-making grades to \$38.67 for the week ended Sept. 10.

The figure, a drop from the preceding week's \$40.40, is the lowest recorded since August, 1950. "Steel" stated.

Job Prospects

OTTAWA. (CP)—A peek into the future shows a bright prospect for job-hunting university graduates, the national employment service announces.

In a special bulletin reviewing supply and demand for professionally-trained persons, the NES executive and professional division said Thursday the demand for university-trained workers generally will remain in balance with supply for the next few years.

There were several notable exceptions. Jobs available in engineering, teaching, architecture, geology and health and welfare work exceeded the available trained personnel.

The bulletin repeated its forecast made last year of a teacher shortage totalling 25,000 in 1955.

In engineering, the bulletin said the demand "is definitely greater than the supply."

It is also estimated that the demand for graduates in engineering will average at least 3,000 a year for some years yet.

Architects graduating in the next four years will be less than 100 each year. The demand is expected to exceed the supply slightly for the next few years.

Graduates in commerce and business administration are expected to number about 800 each year for the next three years and they should have no trouble finding jobs, particularly if they have specialized in accounting, market research, advertising, sales, statistics, insurance underwriting, actuarial work and purchasing.

The bulletin said graduate geologists are still in high demand and the shortage "is producing better salary offers from employers."

In the field of health and welfare, embracing the professions of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, veterinary science, nursing, household science, social work, physical education and therapy, the demand is strong.

The armed forces still are short of doctors despite "attractive offers covering assistance over the last two years of the course."

Food-Devouring Locusts Threaten 30 Countries

LONDON. (Reuters)—Food-devouring desert locusts, increasing at a phenomenal rate, are threatening 30 Asian and African countries, a scientific expert warned Thursday.

Dr. Boris P. Uvarov, director of the anti-locust research centre here, appealed to the nations lying in the "danger zone" to bury their political differences and unite against the voracious pests.

He said the main reason for the rapid increase of the desert locusts is the failure of these countries to join in the international control campaigns.

If they remain unchecked, the swarms of locusts have before them a breeding area stretching from the North Atlantic and Mediterranean coast of Africa, through the entire Middle East and across the Arabian peninsula to India, Pakistan and the Soviet republics in central Asia.

Dr. Uvarov said that to keep a locust breeding ground under control there must be a regular killing of virtually 99 out of every 100. If this slaughter is relaxed, the situation begins to get out of hand.

In its short life of a few months, a female locust is likely to produce 300 offspring.

A swarm may number up to 90,000,000 locusts. In flight they shut out the sun and give the impression of a sudden eclipse. Tons of vegetation and grain are consumed by these swarms.

Dr. Uvarov said the immediate threat is to Kenya, Britain's fertile East African colony. He also reported that several swarms have been seen in Nigeria for the first time.

"In the spring the danger will be to the countries of the Middle East," he added.

Dr. Uvarov said the desert locusts have been spreading out now for three years. He believes the Arabian peninsula is "the key area for the whole anti-locust strategy."

But getting the co-operation of nations remains the big stumbling block.
