FIRE IN A MINE.—The town of New Glasgow, N. S., was startled on Thursday morning by a report that the Drummond colliery was on fire. This mine is the property of the Intercolony coal company, and has been of late exceptionally well worked and the output largely increased. The fire is in a tunnel connecting the main workings with a disused pit, and is as yet some considerable distance from the nearest spot where the men are at work. The plan is to be taken to put out the fire is likely to prove successful. A heavy stone wall is being built across the mouth of the tunnel, shutting it off from the main passages. The air being thus excluded, it is hoped it will soon burn itself out. No serious danger is as yet anticipated. The men are at work as usual, and the horses have not been removed. How the fire originated is a mystery.
