POPE WON'T VISIT EXPO

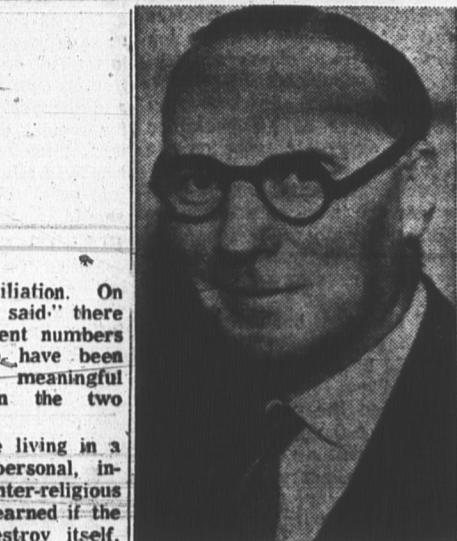
OTTAWA (CP) — Pope Paul won't visit Expo 67 next year, a Roman Catholic Church spokesman said Monday.
