Marion Resigns Job As Chicago White Sox Boss

CHICAGO AP—Marty Marion quit Thursday as manager of the Chicago White Sox, apparently under pressure, and it was strongly suspected his successor will be Al Lopez, former Cleveland Indians pilot.



FREE TO PLAY

In resigning with a year still to go in a two-year contract, Marion said: "They (White Sox officials) were not happy with my work." Marion's resignation came two weeks after Stan Hack quit as field manager of the Crosstown Chicago Cubs and marked the fourth such big league action since the 1956 season ended.

Bucky Harris quit recently as Detroit Tiger manager. Harris was replaced by Jack Tiger and Bob Scheffing succeeded Hack on the Cubs. The Cleveland job still is open with Leo Durocher and Kerby Farrell rated top candidates.

SURPRISE DECISION
Vice-President Chuck Comiskey of the White Sox said: "You might say Lopez would be on our list of prospective candidates."
Marion's decision came as a surprise. The former star shortstop of the St. Louis Cardinals directed the White Sox to a second straight third-place finish in the American League this year.

Boxing Is Perking Up

NEW YORK (AP)—We haven't talked much about boxing recently, what with the world series, football and one thing or another bumping heads to take over the spotlight.
This fall marked the first in several years we have not had an outdoor heavyweight championship fight. Oddly enough, nobody has seemed to miss it, except maybe the promoters. Last month there was a welterweight championship bout in Syracuse, with Carmen Basilio regaining his title from Johnny Saxton.
But even that was pretty well lost in the torrid National League pennant race.
MOORE AN ROBINSON
Things are perking up, however. Ray Robinson defends his middleweight crown against Gene Fullmer at Madison Square Garden Dec. 12, and Archie Moore fights Floyd Patterson in Chicago Nov. 30 for the heavyweight crown vacated by Rocky Marciano.
The bouts offer the picture of an elderly man, fistically speaking, trying to turn back the clock and repel the surge of youth. Time is running out on both Moore and Robinson.
Logically, it would seem that if Robinson plans to meet Fullmer at all he would want it to be as soon as possible, as he will get no better as time marches on while Fullmer, filled with the vitality of youth, might improve.
HARD TO HANDLE
Right now the rugged Fullmer figures to give the fading Robinson, once unquestionably one of the greatest fighters who ever lived, possibly more than he can handle.
Robinson still is dangerous as long as his legs hold out. He still is capable of the bewildering flurries which in a few seconds can take a man out for good, but if the opponent is rugged enough to withstand the early flurries and keep coming, it's a question of how many such flurries sugar will have left.
The husky Utah youth, who works at his job of apprentice welder, never has been knocked out. If he can get beyond the fifth round, it's liable to be a long evening for Robinson.

To Finish Season With Elbow Cast

HAMILTON, Ont. (CP)—Tony Curello, Hamilton Tiger-Cats' quarterback, will finish the Big Four football season with an elbow-high cast protecting a broken left arm suffered in a game Oct. 13, the club announced Wednesday.
X-rays Tuesday show that the injury, first diagnosed as a sprain, was a clean hair-line break.
Curello played last Saturday against Montreal Alouettes with a wrist cast protecting the injury. He had six passes intercepted as the Al's crushed Hamilton 62-14.

N. S. Senior Loop To Stay On Paper

HALIFAX (CP) — President John Mullane of the Nova Scotia Senior A Hockey League said Wednesday the league will remain "on paper" until the next annual meeting scheduled for Aug. 15, 1957.
Chances of the league ever seeing actual play in that time are "hopeless" President Mullane said.

800 Fans Turn Out To See Bathurst In Practice Session

BATHURST (CP) — The parking problem the area about the Bathurst Arena Wednesday night was at its worst as about 800 fans swelled the rink to catch a view of Lou Kiley, newly signed playing coach of Bathurst paper-makers' champions of the North Shore Hockey League.
Eighteen players worked through session under his direction and the rail birds apparently liked what they saw.
Officials of the club said that of the 2,100 seats available at the Arena, 1,400 holding seats have already been sold.
Many improvements have been effected, including increased seating capacity.
Among the players who have been turning out regularly over the past two weeks, Goalie Hum Hicks, Amby Leblanc, Gerry Norman and Pete Vanderwey were on hand for the workout.
Goalie Hicks, who is from Sackville and has fought many Hockey battles between the Papermaker Pines, looked good in practice.
Norman is from Philadelphia of the American Hockey league and was a former linemate of Lonnie Gaudet when the pair carried the puck for St. Mary's Junior Squad.
It is not certain the playing coach will take to the ice in Saturday's game but it is expected the lineup will be announced either today or tomorrow.

Bardstown Wins Trenton Handicap

CAMDEN, N.J. (AP)—The Catumet Farms' Bardstown won the \$31,400 Trenton handicap Wednesday by about a neck over Mrs. John W. Galbreath's Summer Tan before a crowd of 18,903 at Garden State Park.
Third in the field of seven was Alfred Vandee—It's Find.
Willie Hartack rode the four-year-old son of Alibhai, who stepped the mile and one-quarter on a muddy track in 2:01 4-5, compared with the track record of 2:01 set by Vanderbilt's Social Outcast in winning the 1955 Trenton.
Bardstown carried top weight of 126 pounds, and paid \$6.40, \$3.60 and \$2.40. Summer Tan, with 122 pounds and ridden by Dave Erb, returned \$3.40 and \$2.60, while Find, who set the pace with Benie Green up, carried 118 pounds and was \$3.80 to show.
The winner collected \$54,550.

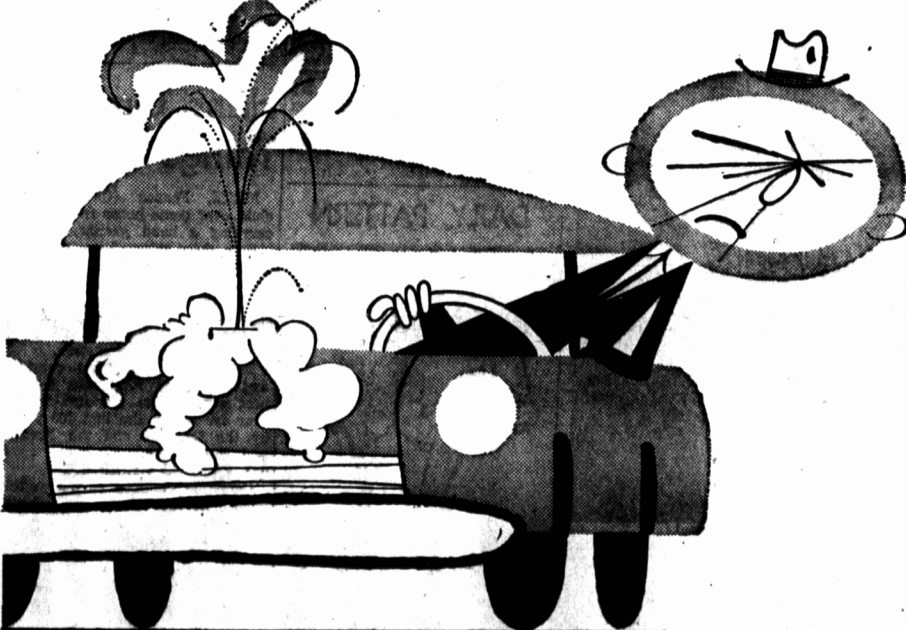
