PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

The Supplementary Estimates.

A PROVISION FOR LADY THOMPSON.

OTTAWA, May 22.

Supplementary estimates for the fiscal year ending June 30, were brought down last night. They total \$1,143,206, made up as follows: Unprovided items, \$12,201; open account, \$550,000; chargeable to capital, \$31,000; chargeable to consolidated fund, \$708,004.

Among the Maritime items is one to complete the payment for steam communication between Prince Edward Island and the mainland during 1894, as per terms of contract, \$500. Amongst the general items are the following: To cover expenses of the late Sir J. S. D. Thompson's funeral, \$25,000; contribution to the Lady Thompson Fund, \$25,000.

Sir C. H. Tupper is expected to return to Ottawa next week.
