DEATH OF A NATIVE OF MONCTON.—Says the Pictou News: We regret to record the death of Mr. Herbert S. Robertson, son of Mr. William M. Robertson, a native of Pictou Co., but at present residing in Sydney, C. B. Mr. Robertson died at Chatham, New York, on the 31st March, of typhoid fever, after a very brief illness. Mr. R. was born in Moncton, N. B. He went to school in Windsor, Halifax, P. E. Island and Antichat. While in P. E. Island he lived with Rev. Alexander McLean, of Belfast (now of Hopewell, N. S.) who took a deep interest in his education and has always spoken in terms of respect of his manly, straight-forward character.

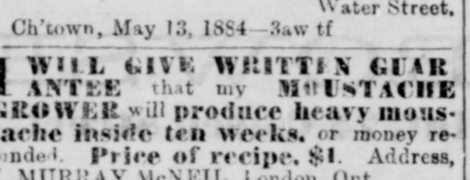
