"Fire engine—There are 2 automobile fire engines, and a fire engine of trailer type, their total capacity, being about 1,900 gallons per minute. As a capacity of 2,300 gallons per minute is required a fourth engine should be added, which should be of Standard capacity, viz. not less than 600 gallons per minute at 120 lbs. net pressure."
