SITS AGAIN ON ARMOR THRONE



Under a plan outlined recently at Bonn, by Allied high commission officials, a huge portion of Alfred Krupp's vast industrial empire will be reverted to 44-year-old mechanical genius, seen above, who was sentenced to 12 years in Landsburg prison as a war criminal in 1945. Following his conviction, Krupp was carried out to lose all his properties. But the order was never carried out. Today, with his sentence reduced, the German stands to inherit a \$70,000,000 collection of engineering firms, locomotive and motor works, shipyards, trading companies and real estate. The allied aim was to break up his industrial monopoly and get the family out of the munitions business. But the need to re-arm, according to reports in Germany, may force West Europe to use Krupp's genius with guns. —(S. N. S. Photo)

Million Dollar Order For More CNR Diesels

MONTREAL, Sept. 7 - An 18.9 million dollar order for 102 road and switcher diesel locomotives was announced here Friday by E. A. Bromley, vice president, purchases and stores, Canadian National Railways. When this and previous orders have been filled the C.N.R. will have 448 diesels, not including 26 rail cars, in operation throughout Canada and the United States. At present there are 343 diesel locomotives running on Canadian National lines. All diesels in this year's order, except four switchers for use in the United States, will be operated in Canada. Two 1,000 horsepower switchers will be built by American Locomotive Co. and two 1,200 horsepower units by General Motors. Diesels ordered for use in Canada include, 20 1,600 horsepower road locomotives from Canadian Locomotive Co. Ltd., one of the same type from Montreal Locomotive Works Ltd.; 40 1,500 General Motors road locomotives from General Motors; six 1,300 horsepower road switchers for Newfoundland from General Motors; and twenty-two 660 horsepower switchers from Montreal Locomotive Works.

The present order brings the value of all types of equipment still to be delivered to the C.N.R. to 67 millions. Each tender must be accompanied by a certified cheque on a chartered bank in Canada, payable to the order of the Minister of Public Works, or Bearer Bonds as specified in the form of tender, for 10% of the amount of the tender. NOTE: Upon application to the undersigned, the Department will supply blue-prints and specification of the work on deposit of a sum of \$20.00, in the form of a certified bank cheque payable to the order of the Minister of Public Works. The deposit will be released on the return of the blue-prints and specification within a month from the date of reception of tenders. If not returned within that period the deposit will be forfeited.

Fur Production Will Decline

OTTAWA, Sept. 7 - (CP) - Canadian fur production will decline this year, but dealers here say there still will be plenty of luxurious fur coats and neckpieces. The Bureau of Statistics reported Thursday a reduction in the Canadian fur farm population of fox and mink, particularly fox. As a result, the bureau estimates production of standard, silver and new type fox pelts will be down by more than 40 per cent from last year. The bureau didn't give the reason for the big reduction in the fox population. But one fur dealer said fox is not so much in demand and he presumed lack of demand resulted in a cull-down.

Bevanites Give Economic Plan

LONDON, Sept. 7 - (Reuters) - Left-wing Bevanites Thursday produced a plan for British economic independence from the United States—nearly two centuries after the U.S. gained independence from Britain. Leader of the new "war of independence" is Harold Wilson, one of three leading Bevanites who said the scale of British rearmament was too great when they resigned their posts in the late labor government last year. Wilson, 36, former board of trade president, put forward his plan in a pamphlet, "In place of dollars," published by the Weekly Tribune, which speaks for Aneurin Bevan, leader of the left-wing labor faction.

The plan is likely to provoke one of the main controversies at the forthcoming annual conference of the labor party at Morecombe.
