Next Week's Confederation Centre Films Project Full Range of Scottish Life

"Scotland on the Screen" a series of Scottish films, will be presented by the Clan MacLeod Society, Charlottetown, on Nov. 8 at the Confederation Centre Theatre.

The films have been produced for the Films of Scotland Society, which was set up in 1958 on the initiative of the then Secretary of State for Scotland, to promote the production and distribution of films in the National Institute. The government was aware of the need for films which would project the full range of the country's life and achievements and not be content with picturesque irrelevancy.

Over these 16 years it has become the constant aim of the committee to extend and deepen in the film picture of Scotland. To do this they have made films not only of the scenic beauty and romantic tradition of Scotland, but also of the industries which are the basis of the country's well-being. Ship-building, hydro-electricity, steel mill, aluminium, woolen manufacture, whisky,

agriculture and forestry — these are some of the subjects which have been imaginatively brought to the screen.

The program for Canada — the third that has been mounted — presents a balanced picture of the country.

Beyond the "Grand Plains" the story of Aberdeen shire, a region of contrasts, there is a small world of life, peace between the coastal villages exposed to wind and sea, and the broad sheltered valley of the Dee. Patient camera and imaginative selection have caught the elusive qualities of the area and there emerges a wise and true picture of the working life of Aberdeenshire.

"Castles and Country" fits its theme in the country's fine buildings, preserved with care. Eric Linklater's commentary stresses the contrast between the wild beauty of nature and the ordered architecture. There is history of another kind in the film of King Olaf's State Visit to Edinburgh—a gesture he inspired in recognition of

the hospitality extended to the Norwegian forces in Scotland during the war.

"Champions in the Sun" pays a tribute to the men who have made Scottish livestock known all over the world. The new setting of the Royal Highland and Agricultural Society's annual show at Inverlorn near Edinburgh, is becoming increasingly familiar to Canadian visitors. "Sons of Scotland" draws on the country's rich store of music and art. The Scottish Painters reflect contemporary achievement in Scottish art.

Grand Rapids Project Starts Delivery In Dec.

WINNIPEG (CP) — Creation of a massive lake is under way in northern Manitoba in a long-awaited prelude to the first transmission from the \$140,000, 600 Grand Rapids hydro-electric project.

Manitoba Power, the provincial public power agency, says the dam will be gradually chocking off the river on its way to Lake Winnipeg, 235 miles north in 1960.

Final stage in a flooding program that will back up Saskatchewan River water to a 2,000-square-mile reservoir will be completed next year.

Holding back the water are 16 miles of dikes made of rock and earth. They actually form a huge dam which, from the air, resembles a V with the river entering the open end.

At the point of the V, water will be channelled through a reinforced concrete intake structure to drive the turbines in the powerhouse below.

Only one of three 110,000-horsepower generators in the powerhouse will be put into operation in December. The other two will be activated next year. Space has been left for a fourth unit to be installed when needed.
