DETROIT (AP)—The Detroit Red Wings parlayed four lines and a tight defense Sunday night to whip the Toronto Maple Leafs 4-1 and climb to one point behind the third-place Leafs in the National Hockey League.

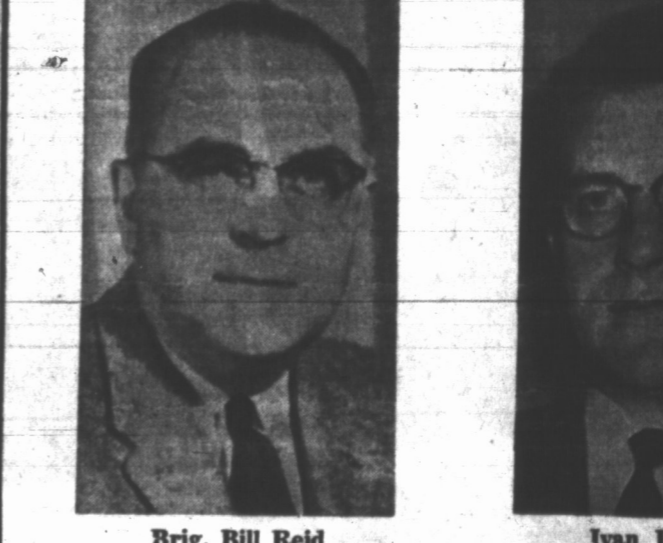

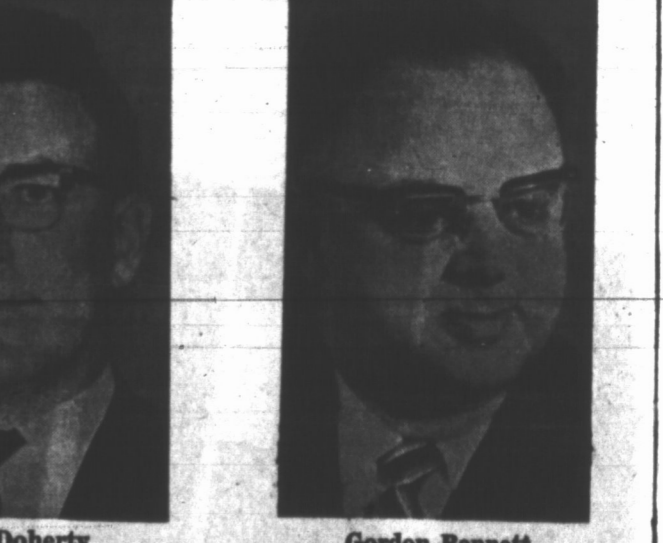
