CAPE TOWN, Aug. 13.—The German troops on the Damaraland frontier have defeated the forces of the rebel chief Afrikander. The rebels have lost heavily. The German lost Lieut. Herzog and 10 troopers killed and a number wounded.

VICTORIA, Aug. 14.—The full court today granted leave to appeal the Nelson murder case of James Woods, sentenced to be hanged, and who was respited. The defence claims that the disposition made by Woodard, Wood's victim, was improperly admitted at the trial, the deceased not having been in expectation of death when he made it.

NELSON, B. C., Aug. 14.—On Thursday night, H. V. Swyny, Toronto, shot Alice Wells, a keeper of a house of ill fame and then turned the pistol on himself, dying almost instantly. He had a wife and family in Canada.

LONDON, Aug. 15.—Mr. Edward Langtry, husband of the notorious 'Jersey Lily', stated on Friday that he had come to London to bring suit for absolute divorce from his wife, and that papers in the action would be served on her by his direction this week. Mr. Langtry said that he absolutely ignored the California divorce secured by his wife last spring, and that he had instructed his solicitor to bring suit without regard to the action of the American courts. He said that he would name as co-respondents several distinguished personages, a well known sporting baronet, an officer of the Guards and an extravagant patron of the turf, who died in America two or three years ago. Mr. Langtry said that he was convinced he was now determined to 'put his foot down.'
