Fever in the Milk.

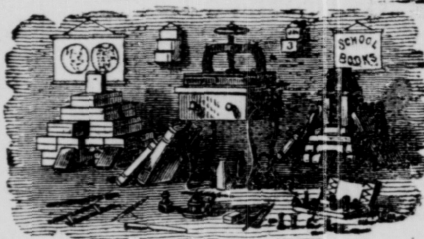
