Safety Precautions In Seal Hunting Will Be Discussed

The necessity of having adequate survival and safety equipment in sealing operations will be brought to the attention of sealers at a meeting called by the provincial department of fisheries, Friday evening at the Queen Hotel in Charlottetown.

Fisheries Minister Leo Ross said that sealers should be aware of other phases of Red Cross activities which will receive certificates of merit.

FORMS MAILED
Assignment forms will be mailed to the some 36,000 former insurance subscribers across the province. Individual payments were discontinued last December—and it is hoped they will be mailed back in enclosed return envelopes by March 15, so the Hospital Service Commission will have time to sort out the replies and turn over to the hospital association the rebate money, as that portion of it, that has been assigned by the individual subscribers.

Mr. Seiler emphasized that there is no thought of trying to get control of the rebate money and prevent it reaching the hospital who paid it in prior to last December. The money will be returned to them as promised by the government, there is no attempt to interfere with that, but he is in appeal to have a portion of that money assigned or turned over to the hospitals, so that they will have something with which to solve the financial problems that they are facing at the present time.

PORTION SUGGESTED
The assignment forms will be assigned to each subscriber that he assign a portion of his rebate check to the hospitals. If any one feels like turning over the entire amount, the action will be welcomed, but a portion of the money will also serve a useful purpose, Mr. Seiler said.

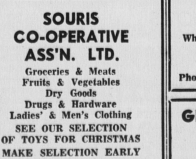
