Pictured above is the new City Flusher which went into operation yesterday. The machine is a Bickle-Seagrave with a capacity of 1,800 gallons. It has four flushing nozzles all of which can be used at one time or individually. The flusher can drive in the middle of the street and do effective work on either side. It has a sprinkler attachment for keeping down dust on dirt streets and possesses a fire hose attachment which would enable it in an emergency to be used as a fire fighting unit. Helicopters May Fly With Lower Ceiling

OTTAWA, (CP) — Canada has amended her air navigation orders to permit lower weather operating conditions for helicopters which previously had to obey the same rules as conventional aircraft. The transport department announced Wednesday that henceforth helicopters flying in the vicinity of airports and capable of communicating with the control tower may be allowed to operate within a defined area around the airport with weather limits of a 500-foot ceiling and one mile forward visibility.
