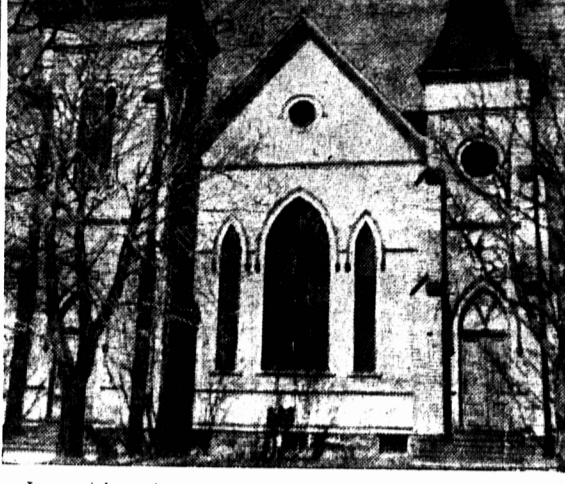

Special Services Mark The 100th Anniversary Of S' side United Church

In special services at Trinity United Church (above) in Summerside yesterday, the congregation observed the 100th anniversary of their first church in Summerside.



Rev. Dr. A. E. Kerr, president of Dalhousie University, and formerly the principal of Dalhousie University, preached the sermon both morning and evening and assisted the minister, Rev. C. Daniel Matheson, in conducting the services.

At the morning worship Dr. Kerr used the text "God Is A Spirit," and those who worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth.

He traced the evolution of worship through various stages from the early form of ceremonial worship used by ancient Israel to the congregational worship as used by the United Church.

"Worship," said Dr. Kerr, "has not always been conducted on the level with which we are familiar. It has evolved from the sacrifice of living objects and observance of ancient ritual to congregational worship in the reading of scriptures, saying of prayers and singing of praise."

In emphasizing the message of his text, Dr. Kerr told the congregation that a church should be an organization of service and not merely a school of doctrine.

At the evening worship he used the text, "What must I do to be saved?" and answered this question in an interesting and illustrative manner.

"One of the best arguments for the cause of salvation and Christianity," said Dr. Kerr, "is the character of God reflected in the character of a fellow man, and," he added, "a man who is truly saved must be a part of his whole environment, and must be concerned with all mankind."

Under the direction of the organist, Miss Mary Geldart, special music was provided in the morning by the regular choir, and in the evening by the male choir of the church.
