

Third Time For Her Husband To Escape

HALIFAX (CP) — Mrs. E. Grandy thanked God for the third time Thursday, after learning her husband had been rescued with his eight-man crew off the coast of St. Pierre and Miquelon in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. It was the third time her husband had a narrow escape at sea. The 58-year-old skipper survived a torpedoing in the Second World War and lived after fire ripped through his ship in 1952. Capt. Grandy was picked up by the freighter Roonagh Head Thursday, 19 hours after abandoning the sinking schooner Joann Elamae in a stormy sea off the south coast of Newfoundland. "I've had nothing to eat since I heard about it on the radio this morning," Mrs. Grandy said, "the rescue was the best news I've ever heard."
