

Dairymen Defeat Angels To Increase Leadership

The Sunshine Island Dairy increased their lead in the City Softball League yesterday evening by defeating the Guardian Angels 10-6 in a game played on the Old Diamond.

As a result of their win the Dairymen lead the league with a total of 18 points, four more than the second place Liguorian Youth Club and five more than the third place Angels.

The Dairymen were led by their win by the five-hit pitching of right-hander Art Ballem. Ballem, who has yet to taste defeat, struck out five batters and walked a like number.

Garth Crockett of the Dairy led all batters with three hits while Hartinger of the Angels picked up two base knocks in four trips.
