Dieppe Raid Classed With Charge Of The Light Brigade

By ALAN HARVEY Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP)—A new British book accords the Canadian raid on Dieppe a place in military history alongside Waterloo, Blenheim and the Charge of the Light Brigade. "Undoubtedly... one of the most vivid and dramatic episodes in the story of war," writes R.W. Thompson in "Dieppe at Dawn" (Hutchinson), the latest account of the clash of arms that took place on the French beaches Aug. 19, 1942. Of an Allied force of nearly 6,000, 4,963 were Canadians, and of those 2,211 came back. Nearly 1,000 were killed and Canadian prisoners were taken in nine hours of combat outnumbered those captured in 20 months in Italy. "On the basis of those chilling statistics, Dieppe has been classified by many as a failure—some say a necessary failure. Thompson, a former war correspondent, refrains from any sweeping judgments, but an uneasy note in his writing suggests he is by no means convinced that the raid was in fact an essential prelude to the 1944 landings. Perhaps his chief criticism is of the lack of firepower. "Surely this lesson did not need to be learned as late as August, 1942? Had it not been learned at Gallipoli, for example, in the First World War, and in a thousand land battles?" One reviewer of "Dieppe at Dawn" goes further. Milton Shulman, formerly of Toronto and a wartime Canadian Army major now with The Evening Standard, lists "four major blunders"—in regard to timing, terrain, lack of supporting fire and tactical surprise. Criticism apart, Thompson's book is in essence a detailed review of a tragic, heroic action. The British author becomes deeply involved in his narrative. Describing how men were "slaughtered in droves," he says: "These things beat upon my mind like the strokes of a hammer, day after day. But there is no way out. I must pursue this repetition, seeking constantly to curb the use of words such as heroism, courage, devastating, fury that spring constantly to my pen... in their emphasis the tragedy may emerge the more starkly."

IN MEMORIAM

W. FRANKLIN HICKOX On Sunday evening, January 22, 1956, W. Franklin Hickox of Springfield, Lot 67, passed peacefully on to his eternal reward, ending a long and useful life. For the past months it was apparent to his family that his course was almost run.

The oldest member of the community, he was a respected resident, a man of high repute who stood steadfast in his convictions, a cherished father, much loved by his family.

The late Mr. Hickox born at Wheatley River on March 16, 1860, the son of John and Rebecca (Barrett) Hickox and the twin brother of George, was the last member of a family of ten. He was twice married, his first wife being Matilda Waverly Hunter River, his second, Catherine MacLeod of Stanchell. Both predeceased him.

In 1881 he settled in Springfield and resided there until the time of his death. Mr. Hickox was a member of the Christian Church at Breadalbane where he served as Elder for many years and in later years as Honorary Elder.
