### A State-Union Crisis Is Faced In Arkansas Schools

It may be a painfully slow process, but there can be only one outcome of the Arkansas school crisis. Governor Orval Faubus must bend to the federal will, voluntarily or by compulsion.

The drama being played out in the Arkansas capital of Little Rock has begun inching, by slow legal steps, toward a showdown. The legal paths are complex. In its first move the federal government is seeking a court order—an injunction—directing Governor Faubus to cease interference with the orderly mixing of Negro and white students in Little Rock's Central high school.

The governor's next move is difficult to predict. He may ignore any injunction. That would open the way for a charge of contempt of court. If held in contempt, the governor could be jailed—if the federal authorities chose to go so far.

### Montreal Gets 'Flu Vaccine

MONTREAL (CP) — Inoculations of key personnel, such as doctors and nurses, against Asian flu will start in Montreal next week, public health officials said Wednesday.

The first batch of vaccine has arrived in the city from the United States, where the government approved its export to Canada.

Nurses and doctors at Montreal General Hospital will start getting inoculations Monday.

Hospital authorities said there will be enough vaccine only for key personnel. This group could include also members of the city fire department and other public servants whose services should be maintained without interruption.

Hospital physicians, warning against any mass hysteria, said all information shows the disease is a mild type and unless there are complications sufferers could be treated at home under care of the family physician.

### Special 'Flu Benefits Asked

NEW YORK (AP)—Longshoremen who will unload a luxury liner arriving with Asia flu cases were promised today they and their families will be paid special benefits if they contract the disease.

The promise from the New York Shipping Association — international Longshoremen's Association welfare fund came after union officials reported the men might not be willing to handle baggage on the Italian liner Vulcania. The ship is due here today.

There are 50 suspected cases of Asian flu reported among the 963 passengers.

The special arrangement for the longshoremen provides that if they or members of their immediate families contract the flu within two weeks, they will get special benefits from the welfare fund. The amount was not disclosed.
