A DOCTORS DIFFERENCE.

Sir,—In Tuesday's paper your correspondent "J. K. D." refers to Dr. Brown attending the accident on Fitzroy St. With all his deference for law and justice, it seems to me that Dr. Brown is a little too late and a little too early. Who is registered? The whole tone and tenor of your correspondent's letter suggest the selfish spirit of his author.

Is a man's life not more dear to him than anything else? When nothing can be done to alleviate his sufferings when sick, when someone steps in who can help, he must let him die to comply with the law, because not registered. What kind of law is this? Because a man registers, will this give him the power to save life? Will this "most powerful education," to use his words, do it? When a man comes from college first he thinks he knows all, but he is only beginning to learn. He must use more common sense and good judgment, and throw his selfish spirit overboard if he expects to be a boon to suffering humanity, and not need a Medical Council which "possesses almost absolute power," to use his words, to protect him. Let justice be his protection in the true sense. "Man's inhumanity to man" repeated, "J. K. D." Now, Mr. Editor, I can speak from experience in reference to Dr. Brown's capabilities in serious cases, as many more can testify who have had occasion to call him in. His cases are not confined to home. He has treated many by mail in the United States and Canada, and has had marked success. True, he is not as tough as some of our younger physicians, as he has gone through serious difficulties in the way of health to hold his lack, "J. K. D." should test his knowledge and education on medical cases and see for himself before he speaks. I daresay Dr. Brown could show many testimonials, as well as other evidence, of what he can do. He is not a blow, but does his work earnestly and carefully.

I hope the time may come soon, Mr. Editor, when mankind shall aim to be more helpful to each other. Then truth and liberty will prevail.
