Sgt. R. Mellish Of S'side Home From Korea

Sgt. Ralph Mellish of the American army, son of Mr. and Mrs. Milton Mellish of Summerside, has arrived home on rotation leave from Korea, after serving there since July 8th, 1950.

Prior to that, he had done two years occupation duty in Japan.

Sgt. Mellish left Summerside about four years ago when he was 18. Six months later he joined the army and was sent to Japan with the infantry in November, 1948. He was with the first American division to land in Korea after the North Korean invasion, and after serving a short time with the infantry, was transferred to the transportation corps where he was engaged in headquarters work mostly in Pusan, in the south-east section of the country. Pusan, he explains, is full of refugees from the north and they are living under wretched conditions, some in shacks which have been made out of empty tin cans.

Sgt. Mellish said that while the main thought of most of the troops is "rotation", morale is remembered by many as a former Unit Public Relations Officer of this station, made a brief visit during the past week from Halifax, N. S.

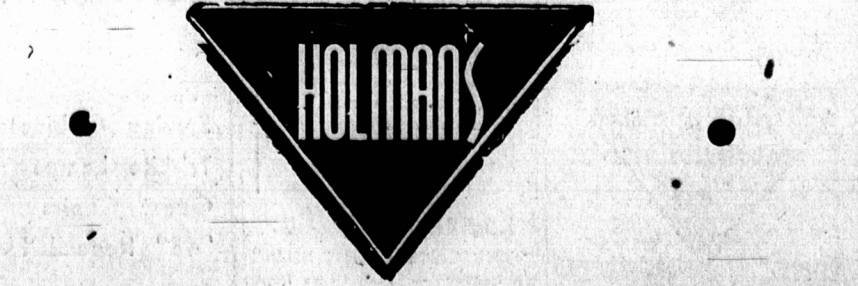
