Paving Of Wood Islands Highway Now Under Way

After nearly two years of preparatory work the final act in connection with the completion of the Trans-Canada section of 11 miles between Wood Islands and Pilette was commenced on Tuesday, when Superintendent George Hawkins of the Island Construction Co. swung his men and equipment into action, laying the asphalt base coat, in preparation for the seal coat.

The equipment, which was brought from Nova Scotia, is on location at the junction of the Selkirk and Surrey roads and is manned by experienced Island operatives who expect to complete the job in five weeks. Operations are conducted from the field office of the Trans-Canada highway unit of the Department of Public Works, located at Belle River, where construction engineer J. A. Reardon is located.

Ross' Bridge will be increased to standard road width of 40 feet, being constructed of concrete on concrete piles, with reinforcing fill-in increasing the width to 55 feet.

An interested spectator in the Trans-Canada work being done on the island is Mr. Reg. McCullough, Deputy Minister, Department of Highways in Nova Scotia, who was outspoken in his approval of this project as well as the performance of the Seaman Mix, which he also saw in operation at the west end of the Province.

Contrary to expectation however, Hon. Dougald MacKinnon is more enthusiastic about the prospects of developing a highly desirable tourist cabin area bordering along the Strait, than a job well done.

"A beautiful farming area, with splendid shore facilities and warmer water for bathing and safety for children, will become available to visitors with the completion of this highway," said Mr. MacKinnon. "An entirely new and desirable scenic drive will be added to the many tourist attractions of which we Islanders boast."
