Another group of farmers who have some special problem are the Island cattlemen. First of all due to indifferent pasture many cattle are not in a finished condition. Next, because of winter feed shortage there is a tendency to reduce the size of the herds. All this adds up to larger than usual offerings of cattle of which a high percentage are not in the best condition.

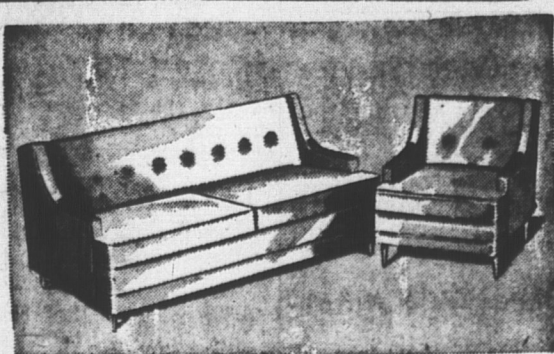

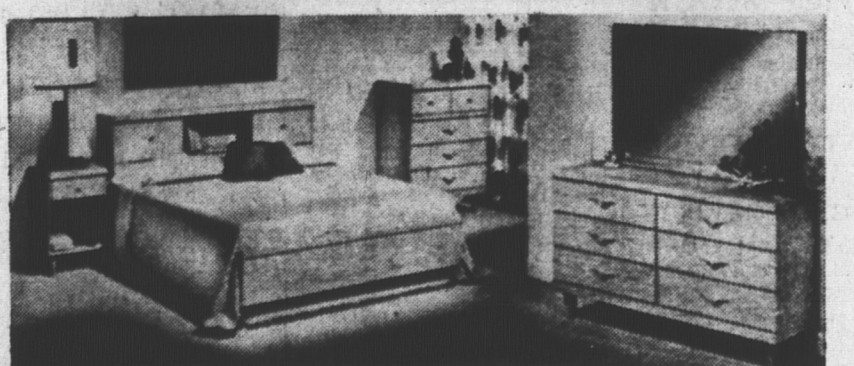
