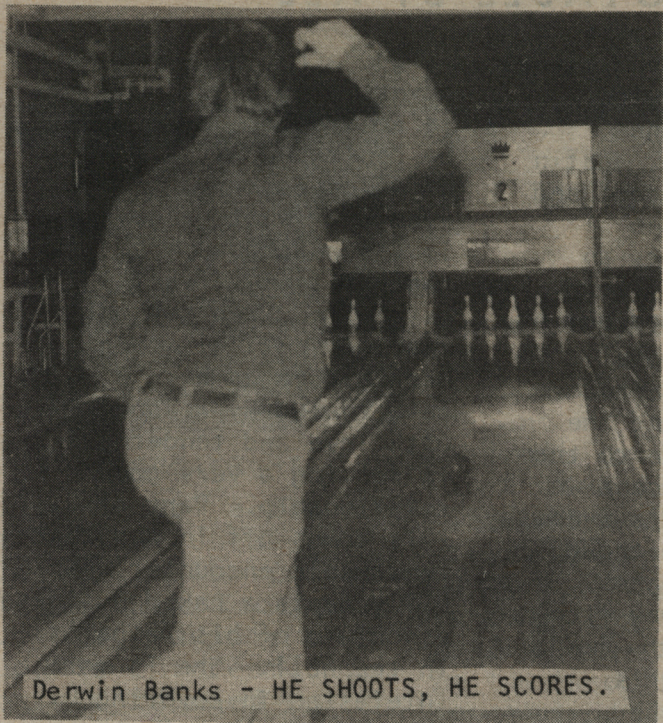


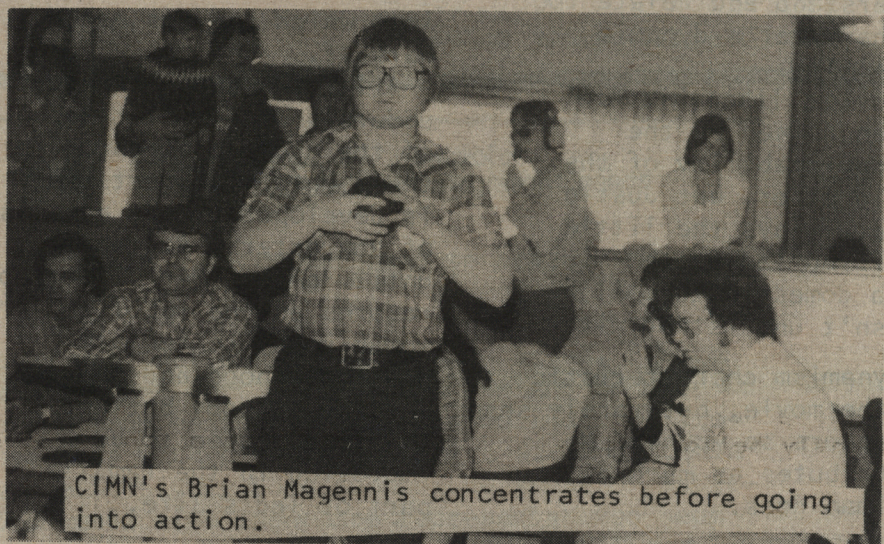

### FIERCELY FOUGHT GRUDGE MATCH

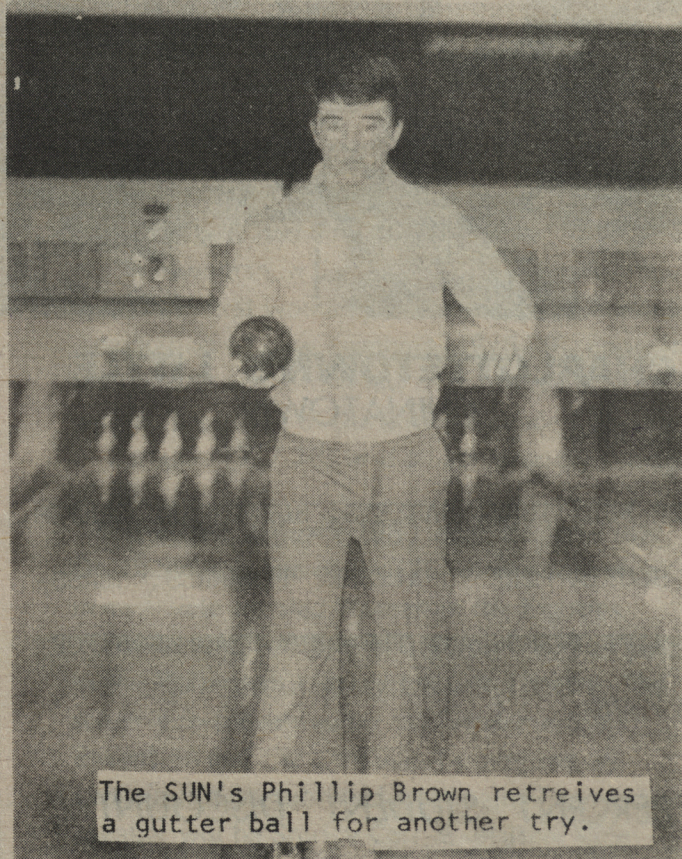
The 1980 Bowl For Millions Campaign for Big Brothers came to an apparently successful end on Saturday at Showboat Lanes in Charlottetown. Saturday was Celebrity Day, the climax of the week long drive for funds and an occasion in which UPEI personnel were rather heavily involved.

The SUN was there to bowl against campus radio CIMN in a grudge match over which feelings had been running high for several weeks. Also from UPEI, and bowling for their respective causes, were English student Marsha Gaudet and university business manager Murray Stevenson. Other notables were Lieutenant Governor Gordon Bennett, Liberal candidate for Hillsborough Gerry Birt, and the Phantom Bowler. Radio stations CFCY and CHTN were both providing on the spot

coverage.

The leading bowlers among the UPEI media proved to be John Gallant for CIMN and Phillip Brown for the SUN. That pair scored 168 and 165 respectively. Chasing at their heels were CIMN's Patrick Kelly at 158 and the SUN's Derwin Banks at 154. The other participants were Todd MacLaughlan, John Cairns, and Richard Lee from the SUN staff along with Robert Page and Brian Magennis of CIMN.

CIMN was late arriving at Showboat Lanes, but when they finally did appear they engaged the SUN in a nip and tuck battle. The newspaper players did eventually emerge the winners with a low single of 107, but CIMN deserves considerable credit for staying close. Their low single was 106, only 1 point lower. CIMN's average score was 142 while the SUN checked in at 130.
