Reservations Held About

Plan

OTTAWA (CP) - The Retail Council of Canada said here it has a "considerable reservations" about the proposed Canada pension plan and the timing of its introduction.

A council brief told the joint Senate - Commons committee studying the plan that it should not be started until there has been a "close review of whether the national economy can afford a plan of this magnitude at this time."

There were pressures in favor of a national health plan, greater spending on education, and more revenue for the provinces. In the light of this there would be "considerable merit" in establishing priorities before embarking on the plan.

Like most Canadians, said the council, it is in favor of a contributory pension plan. But it should be approached with care.

It would be regrettable if Ontario decided to leave the plan, and every effort should be made to so amend the design of the federal plan that participation in it becomes acceptable to the province of Ontario.

The hesitation on Ontario's part appeared to be based on fears that it will have only partial control over the accumulated contributions of the fund which originate in Ontario.

The most readily apparent way of allaying these fears would be to revert to the concept of a minimally funded plan.

Landmark Mansions Purchased

NEW YORK (AP) - Two Park Avenue land mark mansions, about to be razed to make way for a three-story luxury apartment house, have been bought by a granddaughter of John D. Rockefeller for an estimated \$2,000,000. She said she intends to turn them over to the city for cultural use.

The purchaser was identified as the Marquesa de Cuevas, a first cousin of Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York State. She is the former Margaret Rockefeller Strong, now in her 80s, who inherited \$25,000,000 from her famed grandfather at his death in 1937.

She married the late Chilean-born Marquis George de Cuevas in 1927.

The Marquesa has more than a passing interest in the mansions. Since 1938 she has lived in two adjoining houses on East 68th Street, just west of Park Avenue.

The mansions at 680 and 684 Park Avenue are among a group of four that form an architectural unit built between 1909 and 1926.

"FINEST OF ITS TYPE"
The architectural harmony for the entire blockfront has been described by the city's landmarks preservation commission as the finest of its type and period in the U.S.

The Marquesa said she was heartbroken to see the scaffolding being put around the houses as the wreckers moved in.

The wreckers were at work ripping out parquet flooring, paneling and antique marble mantels. But the demolition work was halted when the purchase contract was signed. The mansions will be restored.

The Marquesa said she hopes a few of her friends will join in paying for the houses.
