Quebec Gov't Plans Aid For Broke School Boards

QUEBEC (CP)—With only a few shopping days left until Christmas, teachers in the eastern Quebec municipalities are as broke as the school boards that are sponsoring them.

The hapless school boards have turned to the Quebec government for help. Arranging bank loans to provide money that parents have not paid in some cases since April.

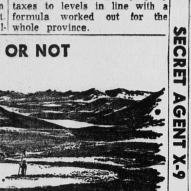
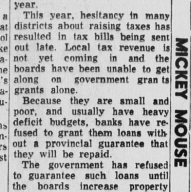
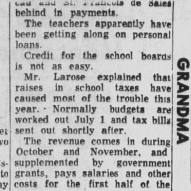
There has been no talk of a bailout among teachers at eight Roman Catholic school boards in the Saguenay-Lake St. John district but Stephanie Poirin, secretary of the Chicoutimi Teachers' Federation, said they are naturally unhappy about the situation.

Regulation of Labels Large For Pesticides

OTTAWA (CP)—The Commonsense Food and Drugs Committee recommended to Parliament Thursday that pesticides be labelled to indicate degrees of danger from poisoning.

The committee, which conducted a series of public hearings on pesticides last fall, proposed that mildly toxic pesticides be labelled in black lettering; "Dangerous unless used as directed" if proposed the same wording, but in red ink, for moderately toxic pesticides.

The report noted that such a committee now meets informally. As a permanent body it would be responsible for coordinating research on pesticides at all government levels and in cooperation with manufacturers.



Mr. Larose explained that raises in school taxes have caused most of the trouble this year. Normally budgets are worked out by July 1 and tax bills sent out shortly after.

This year, hesitancy in many districts about raising taxes has resulted in tax bills being sent out late. Local tax revenue is not yet coming in and the boards have been unable to get along on government grants alone.

Because they are small and poor, and usually have heavy deficit budgets, banks have refused to grant them loans without a provincial guarantee that they will be repaid.

The government has refused to guarantee such loans until the boards increase property taxes to levels in line with formula worked out by the Edmond, L'Anse-St. Jean, Bon-

Early Changes Seen Unlikely In Gov't Of Northern Canada

OTTAWA (CP)—Legislation to revamp government in Northern Canada will come under review in the Commonsense Food and Drugs Committee study next year but extensive changes now seem likely.
