London, September 8.—Mr George W. E. Russell, cousin of the present Duke of Bedford, and under secretary of state for the Home Department in the Rosebery administration, has inaugurated a moment calling for the abolition of the private mad houses, and has announced his intention of asking Parliament to take steps in that direction as soon as it reassembles. He declares that he had, while in office, exceptional facilities for studying the subject of private lunatic asylums, and that they constitute the greatest iniquity in England. Since he has been a member of the Opposition he has gone on investigating the matter, and announces that he will produce before the House revelations of the most startling character. A great sensation has been caused by Mr. Russell's remarks, as it had been generally supposed that the once notorious abuses in connection with these private lunatic asylums had been abolished and were a thing of the past.

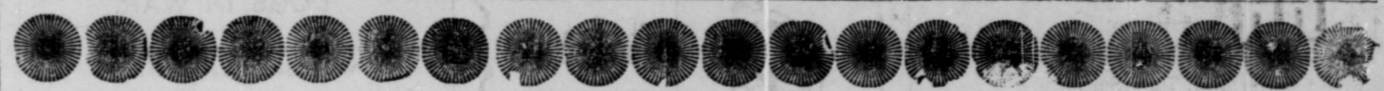
