## Pass Not to Be Included As Part of Average Calculation

At its meeting of Tuesday 6 January 1976, Senate approved the following motion:

That for purposes of calculating averages for UPEI Scholarships, Deans' Lists, standings medals and prizes, a "PASS" grade shall not be included if that grade has been taken on a PASS/FAIL option; that no more than one course per semester shall be permitted on a PASS/FAIL option and that at least four (4) marks per semester shall be used to obtain averages for UPEI Scholarships, Deans' Lists, standings, medals, and prizes; and that the whole question of the PASS/FAIL option be referred to the Examinations and Evaluation Committee for recommendations.

INTENT: Subjects in the Major area are not to be taken on a PASS/FAIL basis.
