A stage with piano was then erected in centre field and a program of singing and folk dancing was put on by 16 ethnic groups of Indians and of European nationalities. Many elaborate and colorful costumes were in evidence as these groups vied with one another in competition. The two hour program was continued for an extra hour.

Tuesday's cool wind did not prevent a number of hardy youngsters from having a dip in the Kitsilano Pool. Miss Lucille Connors, a Kitsilano High School girl was chosen as Kitsilano Queen and with her six maids of honour presided over the afternoon festivities carried on to celebrate Coronation Day at the Pool. In the evening over five thousand thronged that beach for the opening of the Kitsilano Showboat. We arrived there shortly before the first flare was dropped by an airplane to start the evening's display of fireworks over English Bay. The plane returned at intervals to

drop four, five, six and eight flares in groups. One could hear many in the crowd count these as they left the plane, occasionally they anticipated more than were dropped. The brilliant flares were dropped from such a height that only three were still burning when they reached the water.

The group of eight lit up the whole area from Stanley Park to Point Grey and remained burning for what seemed more than five minutes. These were followed by more than half an hour of a brilliant display of rocket fireworks.

At the Kerrisdale Arena, the Sunset Memorial and the Marpole Centres, a battery of television sets showing movies of the Coronation, drew great crowds during the afternoon. Kerrisdale also had street dancing and fireworks at night. Chinatown had street celebrations and fireworks. Thousands thronged Stanley and other parks. Pleasure seekers jammed Malton Park in North Vancouver to watch parades of servicemen, cadets and bands. The shores of West Vancouver and the mountains behind were spaced with flaming bonfires lighted by Scouts to form a background for the fireworks display at Kitsilano. They also held a fishing Derby at Horseshoe Bay and had many kiddies in their fancy dress parade to Park Royal.

The Richmond Coronation Cavalcade had 50 decorated cars and floats; their route was along 15 miles of Lulu Island highways to the Steveston Army and Navy Club where there were presentations. The Brocton Oval had a thousand persons watching a cricket match, where a Canadian team lost to the Commonwealth. Burnaby celebrated all day in Confederation Park with a noon parade, and afternoon games and a stage show in the evening followed by open air dancing.

An ocean tug, bedecked with flags from stem to stern, met a British freighter, outbound, whose superstructure was covered with bunting. As they passed at the Lion's Gate Bridge, the tug blew a staccato blast with its whistle, which was answered in kind and echoed and re-echoed by other craft in Burrard Inlet until the bedlam equalled the sirens and church bells that earlier had heralded the crowning of Queen Elizabeth II.
