Only 3 Canadians Left In Amateur Golf Meet

WHEATLEY Canadian Press Staff Writer MONTREAL, (CP)—The Canadian amateur golf championship struggle underwent a double-barrelled shakedown Wednesday and when the firing was over Britain's 10-man Walker Cup team had six men left in the chase, the United States had seven, and Canada's representation was reduced to three. The biggest jolt suffered by Canada was when Gerry Kesseling of Kitchener, Ont., was eliminated in the fourth round this afternoon by Jimmy Wilson of Scotland 3 and 2. Joe Carr, British amateur champion, moved along through the day's two rounds although he was given a rough passage in the afternoon before he downed Gordon Taylor, Canada's amateur champion 21 years ago and one of Kanawaki's top players, one up.
