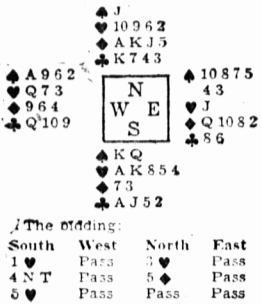


Contract Bridge

SHORT OF IDEAL

South's plan of play in the following hand was not quite the best available.



The bidding: South West North East
1♥ Pass 1♠ Pass
4NT Pass 5♣ Pass
5♥ Pass Pass Pass

When the Blackwood Convention drew the information that North had only one ace, South wisely signed off at five hearts...

West laid down the ace of spades, then, on sight of dummy, snuffed to a diamond...

South saw that a successful diamond finesse would not be conclusive, since he could discard only one club from his own hand...

If West had been afraid to give declarer a ruff-and-discard, i.e. if he had led back a club, South's plan would have worked out beautifully...

McCarthy Predicts Censure Vote

WASHINGTON (AP) - Senator Joseph McCarthy (Rep. Wis.) predicted Friday the Senate will vote to censure him at its session beginning Nov. 8 because, he said, "very few members will consider the evidence with an open mind."

A special Senate committee headed by Senator Arthur Watkins (Rep. Utah), in a report made public Sept. 27, recommended that McCarthy "should be censured" on three specific counts...

The Watkins committee, composed of three Republicans and three Democrats, has recommended unanimously that McCarthy should be censured on these counts...

GUELPH, Ont. (CP) - Ontario cream producers Tuesday night unveiled a plan to reduce the retail price of butter from 20 cents a pound to 18 cents...

Mr. Retnie Fergus, president of the Ontario Cream Producers' Association, told a dairy meeting here the federal government should be persuaded to use agricultural price support funds to get rid of a 13,000,000-pound butter surplus...

He said Canada ended last year with a 13,000,000-pound surplus and seemed likely to have 30,000,000 pounds surplus this year.

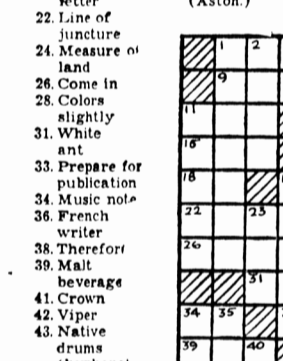
Find Mummified Body of Baby

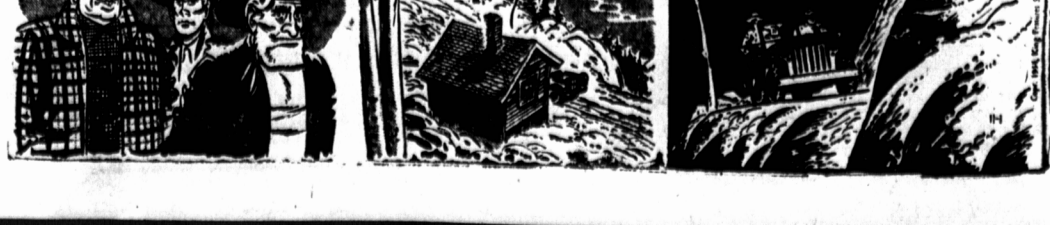
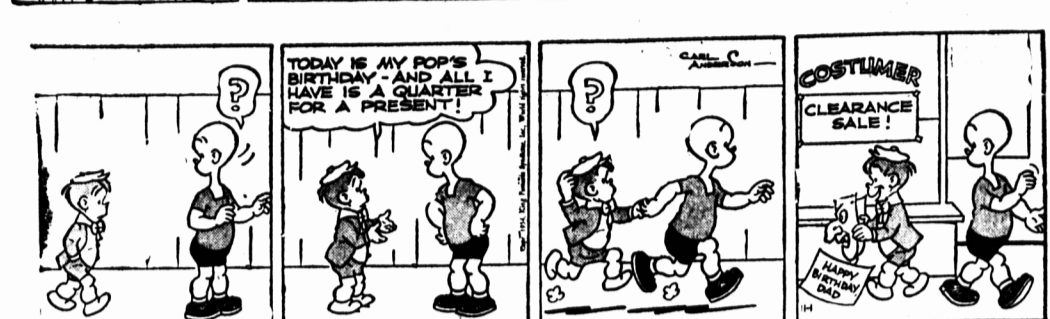
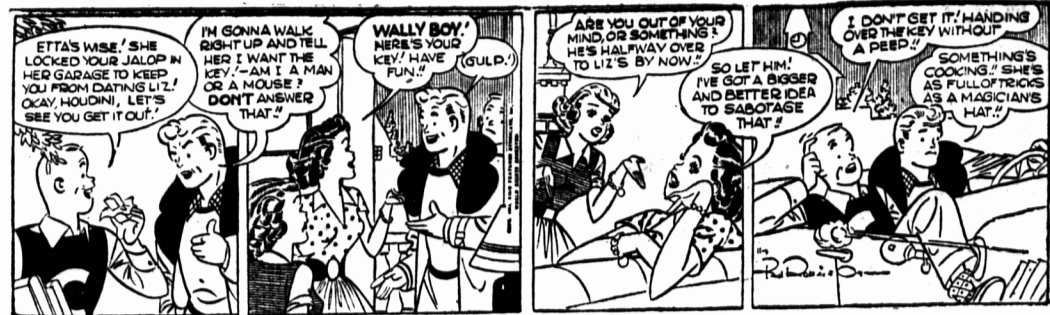


DAILY CRYPTOQUOTE
