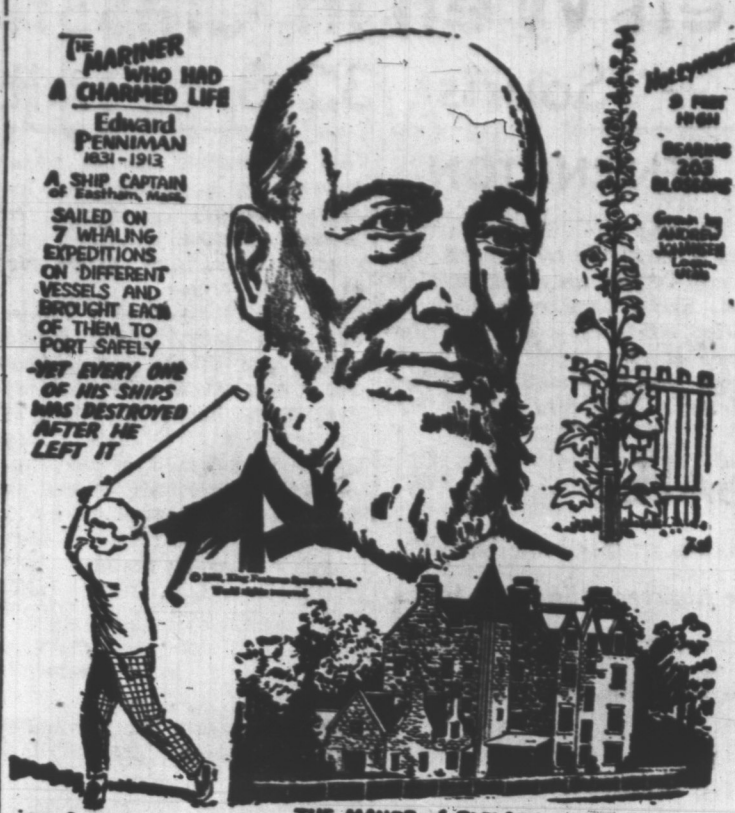

British Doctors Talk Of Health Showdown

EDMONTON (CP) - British doctors again are talking about a possible showdown with the government over the country's national health program.

The 500 doctors attending the annual business sessions of the British Medical Association have made it clear they will withdraw from the government service if the need arises.

The business sessions are a prelude to the joint annual scientific meeting of the Canadian and British Associations starting Monday. Roughly 1,000 Canadian medical practitioners join more than 2,000 of their British associates to exchange ideas on latest developments in their field.

The three-day business meeting of the BMA which ends Saturday endorsed a suggestion that it would be "neither dishonourable, impracticable, immoral nor illogical" to pull out of the health service.
