U.P.E.I.'S First Writing Lab Established

STUDENT SERVICES PROVIDE SERVICES

A Writing Lab has been established on campus and will operate under the supervision of the Department of Student Services.

This project has been discussed with the Dean of Arts and the Chairman of the English Department, and is being implemented with their full support. The lab will operate for the duration of this semester and will begin again in January.

The instructor of the Lab is Breda Foley (B.A., B.E.D., U.P.E.I., 1973-74) Her office is located in the Department of Student Services, and her schedule is as follows:

Monday 5:30-7:00 p.m.
Tuesday 3:30-5:00 p.m.
Wed. 3:30-4:30 p.m.
Thurs. 6:00-7:00 p.m.
Friday 3:30-4:30 p.m.
Sat. IF NECESSARY.

This schedule is tentative and may be changed for the convenience of students.

The Writing Lab has been set up to help students with writing difficulties such as:

1. Emphasis in writing

multi-paragraph essays.

2. Style: tone, irony, allusion, figurative

language, etc.

3. Paragraph analysis: patterns of development, (narrowing topic, gathering, selecting, arranging, revising material), coherence, emphasis, logic.

4. Mechanics and arrangement of a research paper: footnotes, bibliography, title page, table of contents, etc. (Kate L. Turbrian to be used here.)

5. Syntactical analysis: phrases, clauses, simple sentences, agreement, voice, tense (parts of speech).

6. Sentence patterns and variety of sentence structure: simple, compound, complex, co-ordination, subordination, parallel structure, use of modifiers.

7. Run-on sentence and sentence fragment.

8. Punctuation and capitalization.

9. Expression and wordiness (redundancy).

The Writing Lab will operate on a referral basis. Professors should refer any student who is

having difficulty with one or more of the problems listed above to the Lab

for tutorial work. Time blocks will be set up for each student.
