Local and Other Items.

CHEESE AND BUTTER.—A Montreal despatch of the 28th says: The dull tone apparent in the butter market for some time past seems to be deepening. There is scarcely any enquiry for either shipping or local account and the top notch for creamery is 16c. Dairy butter does not appear to be moving at all. Cheese is rather dull. The English cables are unchanged at 37s 6d and there are no signs of activity in any direction. Prices stand at 7 3-8c to 7 1/2c for eastern, and at 7 5-8c to 7 7-8c for western. At Ingersoll yesterday cheese sold at 7 1-2 to 7 5-8c; Belleville, no sales Campbellford, 7 1-2 to 7 9-16c; Madoc, 7 9-16 to 7 5-8.

NOVA SCOTIA'S CROP OUTLOOK.—The outlook for the agricultural year 1898 in Nova Scotia, is, on the whole, satisfactory. The hay crop is an abundant one, being eight per cent above a full average crop on upwards, six per cent. on improved dykelands, and four per cent. on intervals. The large hay crop of last year has told already as the returns show that in many districts there has been an increase in beef and dairy stock. The potato crop promises to be slightly above a full average, and roots generally promise well. With suitable weather the oat and other grain crops will be better than usual. There is quite a notable increase in the acreage devoted to wheat in recent years.

The seller informed the purchaser that it was a pity the old tree was going into decay, as it produced the best fruit of any tree in the orchard. The purchaser determined to see how long he could keep it alive, and it still survives, after almost another century has been added to its venerable years. But it shows signs of final decay, and the parent of all the famous Rhode Island greenings, which has set its grafts on the orchards of almost all the world, will soon be but a neighborhood memory. It is doubtful if there is a more famous apple tree to be found in all Pomona's groves from end to end of the earth.
