## 862 ATTEND CAMPS

### Outdoor Life Is Popular With Island Scouts, Cubs

Prince Edward Island Boy Scouts and Wolf Cubs find the adventure of backwoods camping to be more appealing each year. This was quite apparent during the past two months when a record 862 boys and leaders attended 39 registered camps in this Province.

The spacious grounds of the provincial campsite at Camp Buchan, Point Prim was used by 592 while 270 camped on private property loaned to Troops and Packs for their summer camp. Last year the total in camp was 650.

Wolf Cub camps generally featured a daily swimming program track and field afternoon, outdoor tests of the Wolf Cub program and inter-six ball league, a Pack ramble and the ever popular evening campfire program. Twenty-nine Wolf Cub Packs sent boys to 20 camps. Scout camps were set up under the patrol system where Troops went under canvas with their own scoutmasters and patrol leaders. Patrols generally cooked their own meals under open fires, enjoyed tracking and plaster cast work, bivouacking, pioneering, mapping and compass work, swimming under the guidance of expert swimming instructors, wide games and evening sing-songs around a campfire circle. Nineteen Troops held camps.

### Blight, Aphids Are Prevalent

Late blight conditions continue to prevail in Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia, according to the weekly potato bulletin issued by the research laboratory at Charlottetown.

The bulletin says at Charlottetown the average relative humidity was 88.1 per cent for the period of August 5-11 and some rain fell on each of these days. Since August 15 the relative humidity has been in the nineties and showers have been common. It is therefore important that strict attention be given to the spray schedule.

Aphid populations have been building up in most fields during the past ten days, the bulletin warns. Second brood flea beetles are also gradually increasing. Malathion spray or dust should be applied at regular intervals to keep them under control. The weekly bulletin is issued by F.M. Cannon and L.C. Calbeck of the laboratory staff.
