The Minister of Marine.

Facts and Figures Worth Noting.

The revenue of the Dominion in the last fiscal year was the largest ever obtained, amounting to \$29,635,297, an increase over that of the previous year of \$6,327,891.

The sources of revenue which represent a tax upon the people are those of customs, excise and bill stamps, which together yielded \$23,942,138 in the past fiscal year, against \$17,841,938 in 1877-8, and \$20,664,878 in 1874-5, the last year until the present in which there was a surplus.

Taking the increase of population into account, the rate of Customs taxation per head was in 1881 more than that in 1875 by 38c., or 9 1/2 per cent., an increase which certainly cannot be considered burdensome.

The large surplus of the year, \$4,132,743, warrants the Government in making a reduction in the taxation, and to this end about \$1,000,000 of taxes, representing the duty upon tea and coffee, will be abolished.

The expenditure in 1881 reached \$25,502,554, against \$24,850,634 in 1880, and \$24,488,372 in 1875-6. In order to show the nature of the increase we submit the following statement of details:
