Education does not consist in merely cramming the mind with facts as you would load a ship or a railway car or pack a barrel with herring or apples, or fill a book with the grossest and shallowest of knowledge. In its truest and best meaning it is putting a thing whatever into the mind. It is developing or drawing out what is already there. Education, therefore, is the developing of the whole man. Now, man is a threefold being. He is composed of body, mind and spirit. True education therefore will be physical, mental, and religious. To neglect any one or more of these things is to render education fatally incomplete.
